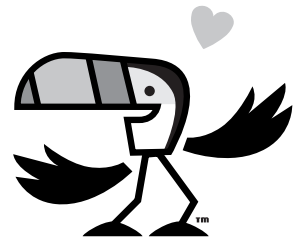

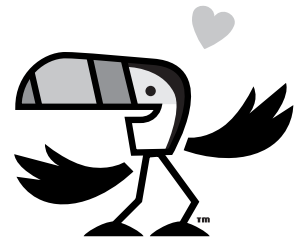
## Identifying Subordinate Conjunctions

20. Once the terrain gets steep, the oxygen becomes less plentiful.

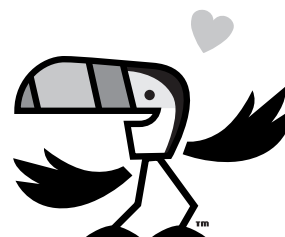
